"The most important one," answered Jesus, "is this: 'Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is one."

- "Hear" Listen!!!
- "The Lord is Our God" the word GOD is plural.
- "The Lord is One" the word ONE is "united."

The Progressive Passion

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength." - Deuteronomy 6:5

- Love the Lord your God stated 10 times in Deuteronomy and nowhere else in the Books of Moses.
- With all your heart it has to be your desire (intrinsic)

Will-Power vs. Want-Power.

"Be careful what you set your heart on, for it might come true! "Love God, then do as you please." - Augustine

- With all your soul the word is "nephesh" it is difficult Probably refers to your life or your total existence!
- With all your strength indicates action!

Many Jews interpret this to be "resources."

Note the word "all" in each phrase!

The Place for these Words
