Jewish Holidays (Holy Days)

Understanding Firstfruits

1. The Plan for Firstfruits

"The LORD said to Moses, "Speak to the Israelites and say to them: 'When you enter the land I am going to give you and you reap its harvest, bring to the priest a sheaf of the first grain you harvest. He is to wave the sheaf before the LORD so it will be accepted on your behalf; the priest is to wave it on the day after the Sabbath. On the day you wave the sheaf, you must sacrifice as a burnt offering to the LORD a lamb a year old without defect, together with its grain offering of two-tenths of an ephah of fine flour mixed with oil — an offering made to the LORD by fire, a pleasing aroma — and its drink offering of a quarter of a hin of wine. You must not eat any bread, or roasted or new grain, until the very day you bring this offering to your God. This is to be a lasting ordinance for the generations to come, wherever youlive."

- Leviticus 23:9-14

- A Celebration It is always on a Sunday.

- Paul declared Jesus our "Firstfruits."

5. The Pattern of Firstfruits

- One man, Adam, brought death! (through sin)
- So, one Man, Jesus, brings life. (through purity)

6. The Praise of Firstfruits

"Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." - 1 Corinthians 15:55-57

- We don't have to live in fear!
