Features of a Successful Worship Service

1. Their hearts were spiritually sensitive.

"The total given by the rest of the people was 20,000 darics of gold, 2,000 minas of silver and 67 garments for priests. The priests, the Levites, the gatekeepers, the musicians and the temple servants, along with certain of the people and the rest of the Israelites, settled in their own towns. When the seventh month came..."

2. The people were unified.

"When the seventh month came and the Israelites had settled in their towns, all the people came together as one in the square before the Water Gate." - Nehemiah 8:1

3. Their purpose for meeting was to hear God's Word.

"They told Ezra the teacher of the Law to bring out the Book of the Law of Moses, which the Lord had commanded for Israel."

4. The families worshipped together.

"So on the first day of the seventh month Ezra the priest brought the Law before the assembly, which was made up of **men and women and all** who were able to understand. ³He read it aloud from daybreak till noon as he faced the square before the Water Gate in the presence of the **men**, **women** and **others** who could understand. And all the people listened attentively to the Book of the Law."
