Things to Consider Before Saying "I Do":

1. "Am I the right person?"

• Marriage is more than *finding* the right person, it is *being* the right person.

2. "What is my friend's family background?"

• People get married before they know each other and divorced when they do.

Background Checklist:

- (1) Childhood happiness
- (2) Parent happiness
- (3) Relationship between the person and the parents
- (4) Home discipline (boundaries/rules)
- (5) Family history physical abuse / substance abuse, etc.
- (6) Positive attitudes
- (7) Sense of security in the home

3. "Am I emotionally prepared?"

Emotional preparation means...

- (1) I'm not rushing into the marriage
- (2) My selfishness is under control
- (3) My love is based on commitment, not emotions

4. "Am I financially prepared?"

• Don't marry for money. You can borrow it cheaper.

5. "Am I morally prepared?"

How to Keep Morally Pure

1. Commit yourself to a Biblical perspective.

"Finally, dear brothers and sisters, we urge you in the name of the Lord Jesus to live in a way that pleases God, as we have taught you. You live this way already, and we encourage you to do so even more. ² For you remember what we taught you by the authority of the Lord Jesus. ³ God's will is for you to be holy, so stay away from all sexual sin. ⁴ Then each of you will control his own body and live in holiness and honour— ⁵ not in lustful passion like the pagans who do not know God and His ways. ⁶ Never harm or cheat a fellow believer in this matter by violating his wife, for the Lord avenges all such sins, as we have solemnly warned you before. ⁷ God has called us to live holy lives, not impure lives. ⁸ Therefore, anyone who refuses to live by these rules is not disobeying human teaching but is rejecting God, who gives His Holy Spirit to you."

3. Establish a personal standard of purity.


The Law of Differences:

4. Know the reasons why you say "No".

Single people not knowing *why* they say "no" will lack moral conviction. They will not be able to resist when alone and challenged.

Two principles inherent in every negative command from God:

- 1. Protection
- 2. Provision

Protection From:

- 1. Sin against my body
- 2. Addiction
- 3. Sexually transmitted diseases
- 4. Unwanted pregnancy
- 5. God's judgment
- 6. Hindering my relationship with God
- 7. Comparison with others
- 8. Guilt
- 9. Hardship of breaking up
- 10. Struggle with purity after marriage

Provision For:

- 1. Beauty in a marriage relationship
- 2. Trust (waiting builds trust)
- 3. Development of maturity
- 4. Clear conscience
- 5. Specialness in marriage

6. "Am I spiritually prepared?"

• The only Biblical command directly related to the selection of a marriage partner is in 2 Corinthians 6:14-16:

"Do not be yoked together with unbelievers. For what do righteousness and wickedness have in common? Or what fellowship can light have with darkness? ¹⁵ What harmony is there between Christ and Belial [Satan]? Or what does a believer have in common with an unbeliever? ¹⁶ What agreement is there between the temple of God and idols? For we are the temple of the living God." - 2 Corinthians 6:14-16

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
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
