"Learning the Deceitfulness of Sin"

The story of King David's affair with Bathsheba and his murder of her husband Uriah is a terrible one. It reminds us that no matter who we are, sin is deceitful.

Observations from the Story:

- 1. David's failure came during great success. *"After the king was settled in his palace the Lord had given him rest from all his enemies around him."* - 2 Samuel 7:1
- 2. David's failure came during his leisure hours.

"In the spring, at the time when kings go off to war, David sent Joab out with the king's men and the whole Israelite army. They destroyed the Ammonites and besieged Rabbah. **But David remained in Jerusalem**." - 2 Samuel 11:1

3. David's failure did not occur suddenly.

"After he left Hebron, David took more concubines and wives in Jerusalem, and more sons and daughters were born to him." - 2 Samuel 5:13

- 5. Snowballing of our sin.

Three Sure Statements About Sin

1. Sin Always Deceives.

"But encourage one another daily, as long as it is called "Today," so that none of you may be hardened by **sin's deceitfulness**." - Hebrews 3:13

• Sin begins so simply but soon becomes complex.

2. Sin Always Destroys.

"Wisdom is better than weapons of war, but one sinner destroys much good." - Ecclesiastes 9:18

• Something is not evil because God calls it sin. God calls it sin because it is evil.

3. Sin is Always Discovered.

"...You will be sinning against the Lord; and you may be sure that your sin will find you out." - Numbers 32:23

David's penalty was four-fold:

- 1. The sword would never depart from his house.
- 2. Evil would pursue him in his own household.
- 3. His wives would be taken by another before him.
- 4. The child born to Bathsheba would die.
