Acts 3:1-10 God's Laws for Life Week 5 Receivers and Contributors

There are cycles in life. Sometimes we must be receivers, but sometimes we must take what we've received and become contributors of God's blessings to others.

Requirements of a Receiver

If you are to receive from God:

1. There must be a need.

"Now a man who was **lame from birth** was being carried to the temple gate called Beautiful, where he was put every day to beg from those going into the temple courts." – Acts 3:2

2. You must request help.

"When he saw Peter and John about to enter, he asked them for money." - Acts 3:3

3. You must expect an answer.

"Peter looked straight at him, as did John. Then Peter said, "Look at us!" ⁵ So the man gave them his attention, *expecting* to get something from them." – Acts 3:4,5

4. You must recognize miracles are from God.

"Then Peter said, "Silver or gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you. In the name of **Jesus Christ** of Nazareth, walk." – Acts 3:6

Characteristics of a Contributor

1. Contributors are doing the right things.

"One day Peter and John were **going up to the temple** at the time of prayer—at three in the afternoon." – Acts 3:1

2. Contributors pay attention to needs.

"When he saw Peter and John about to enter, he asked them for money. **Peter looked** straight at him, as did John." – Acts 3:3,4

3. Contributors inspire hope.

"Then Peter said, "Look at us!" ⁵ So the man gave them his attention, **expecting to get** something from them." – Acts 3:4b,5

4. Contributors have something to give.

"Then Peter said, "Silver or gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk." – Acts 3:6

5. Contributors possess something greater than themselves to give.

"Then Peter said, 'Silver or gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk." – Acts 3:6

6. Contributors reach out and help people.

"Taking him by the right hand, **he helped him up**, and instantly the man's feet and ankles became strong." – Acts 3:7

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
