The Expressions of a Friendship

1. “Love is more than words.” (v. 3,4)

2. “You’re important.” (v. 4)

⁴“Jonathan **took off the robe** he was wearing and **gave it to David.**” - 1 Sam. 18:4

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3. “I will make sacrifices for you.”

⁴“Jonathan took off the robe he was wearing and **gave it to David.**” - 1 Sam. 18:4

4. “I believe in you!”

⁴“Jonathan (gave David) his sword, his bow and his belt.” - 1 Samuel 18:4

5. “I’m willing to become vulnerable.”

⁴“Jonathan (gave David) his **sword, his bow and his belt.**” - 1 Samuel 18:4

When Jonathan gave up his ...

- Sword — He gave up his defense.
- Bow — He gave up his offense.
- Belt — He gave us a picture of total trust!
