Review: Blessed Means...

Happiness vs. Blessedness

- Happiness is to settle for good feelings dependent on our circumstances.
- Blessedness is God giving us an inner quality of contentment regarding life.
- Jesus gives eight ways to receive this blessedness in the Beatitudes.

Beatitude # 1

- Instead of "happy are the rich", Jesus said "blessed are the poor".
 - By counting ourselves as spiritually impoverished.
 - By counting everything as God's, we're His stewards.

1. Find comfort through confession.

2. Find comfort in their sorrow.

"If you love me, keep my commands. And I will ask the Father, and He will give you another comforter to help you and be with you forever—the Spirit of truth." - John 14:15,16

Comforter (παραχλετε) – walk and talk alongside, with strength
