Blessed Are the Pure in Heart

"Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God." - Matthew 5:8

The Contentment of Being Pure:

- 1. The hallmarks of contentment:
 - To have inner joy and peace.
 - To be satisfied with what one is or has.
 - To be free of worries and guilt.
 - To be able to handle annoyances and irritants.
- 2. The meaning of pure ($\chi\alpha\theta\epsilon\rho\sigma\iota$ "catheroi")
 - To drain off or release what's impure.
 - To be free of what shouldn't be there.

Being Pure in Heart

- 1. The comfort of purity
 - A life of purity is a guilt-free life of joy and light. *"The eye is the lamp of the body. If your eyes are healthy, your whole body will be full of light."* Matthew 6:22
- 2. The discomfort of impurity
 - The root of the problem isn't society, it's my heart.
 - "The heart of man is deceitful above all things and beyond cure. Who can understand it?" - Jeremiah 17:9
 - "For out of the heart come evil thoughts, murder, adultery, sexual immorality, theft, false testimony, slander. These are what make a man unclean." - Matthew 15:19

- 3. How to become pure in heart -
 - Recognize that...
 - a) only God can do it. (Psalm 51:10)
 - b) the root problem is internal, not external
 - c) cleansing is a continual process
 - d) obeying God's Word keeps me clean (Psalm 119:9)
 - e) I live for the future with Christ, not just the present

"Since we have these promises, dear friend, let us purify ourselves from everything that contaminates the body and the spirit." - 2 Corinthians 7:1

"Those who cleanse themselves from these things will be instruments for special purposes, made holy, useful to the Master and prepared to do any good work." - 2 Timothy 2:21

"All who have this hope in Him purify themselves, just as He is pure." - 1 John 3:3
