# David the Leader Leading in Prayer

"And David shepherded them with integrity of heart; with skillful hands he led them." - Psalm 78:72

#### What We Have Learned in This Series:

- 1. A leader is humble before his God and before his people. (Ps. 131:1)
- 2. Because of his faith, a leader finds peace within himself and then offers peace to others. (Ps. 131:2)

#### Peace and Rest — (2 Samuel 7:1)

"After the king was settled in his palace and the LORD had given him rest from all his enemies around him..." - 2 Samuel 7:1

- David and Israel were living in times of stability and peace.
- It's been a long time coming!

#### A Man's Dream — (2 Samuel 7:2-3)

- David realized that he lived in a palace while God lived in a tent.
- He decided to build a temple for God.
- His godly counselor, Nathan, encouraged him to fulfill that dream.

LESSON: In good times, David dreamed of honouring God. Do you?

**A Prophet's Vision** — (2 Samuel 7:4-17) God said to Nathan . . .

- *I've been living in a tent for a long time.*
- *I've not asked for a temple.*
- David isn't the one chosen by Me to build the temple.
- I have a plan for someone else to build a temple for me.
- *I will establish the "house of David" forever.*

Nathan told David everything that God said! (Oops!)
 "Nathan reported to David all the words of this entire revelation." - 2 Samuel 7:17

*LESSON:* Sometimes our "dreams and plans" come from. God and sometimes they come from within our own hearts. (Discern!)

#### A Godly King's Response — (2 Samuel 7:18-29)

God said "no" to David and this is how David responded:

- -You are God and I am your servant.
- You have blessed me beyond anything that I deserve.
- You know what is best for me.
- You have done a "great thing" for me by saying No and by communicating it clearly to me!
- Your actions have shown your greatness and your love.
- You have chosen something for me, although different from what I requested. Thank you, and please keep that promise.
- -You are God and I am your servant.
- *LESSON: It is wise to thank God for saying "no" and to express our trust in Him as our God.*

#### Some Lessons to Consider:

- 1. Often, we are too self -focused when we pray and therefore don't consider doing great things for God.
- 2. Often, we pray too small; we dream too little; and we react too much when we don't get our way.
- 3. Often, our plans even approved by Godly friends are not God's plans and we must be willing to adjust.
- 4. When God says "no" it is probably not discipline but redirection!
- 5. We need to trust God when He says No!

"He answered, "While the child was still alive, I fasted and wept. I thought, "Who knows? The LORD may be gracious to me and let the child live.' But now that he is dead, why should I fast? Can I bring him back again? ..." - 2 Samuel 12:22,23

- 6. God honours us for wanting to do great things in His Name.
  "But the LORD said to my father David, 'Because it was in your heart to build a temple for my Name, you did well to have this in your heart." -1 Kings 8:18
- 7. Not everyone is called to build temples! Find what God has designed for you to do and do it with all of your heart.
