GOD'S PROTECTION

WHAT WE WILL LEARN IN THIS SERIES:

- 1. We are like sheep, and therefore unable to provide for ourselves, protect ourselves or save ourselves.
- 2. God is like a shepherd who knows us individually, loves us perfectly, and cares for our every need.

In Verse 4, Some Things Change...

1. The mood changes to one of exception. — "Even though"

- 2. The subject changes to me. "I walk"
 - Some say I am walking ahead of the shepherd.
 - Others say that the shepherd is leading.
- 3. The location changes. "the valley of the shadow of death"
 - Some say that this is a literal valley near Jerusalem.
 - Others suggest that this is a term for a "valley of dense darkness" or a difficult time in one's life.
 - "...have you seen the gates of the shadow of death?" Job 38:17
 - "The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned." Isaiah 9:2
 - Even if this valley is a literal one, then this is easily a reference to difficult times as depression, sorrow, loss, or suffering.
 - Even though this Psalm, and particularly this verse, are read at funerals, it is not really talking of death specifically!
- 4. The verb tense changes. "I will fear no evil"
 - This suggests that I have learned to trust the shepherd.
 - Trust takes time, so this sheep knows the shepherd.
- 5. The reference to the shepherd changes. "for you are with me."
 - When life is good (typical) we can refer to God in the third person (He), but when times get tough, "He" becomes "you".
 - In tough times, we speak to the Lord instead of about the Lord.

IN VERSE 4, SOME THINGS STAY THE SAME...

- 1. It is the same shepherd. "you are"
- 2. It is the same relationship. "with me"

IN VERSE 4, SOME NEW THINGS ARE INTRODUCED ...

- 1. The Tools of the Shepherd.
 - "Your Rod"



- It was for protection (a weapon!)
- It was for discipline.
 - "I will be his father, and he will be my son. When he does wrong, I will punish him with the rod of men..." 2 Samuel 7:14
- It was for counting. Leviticus 27:32 "The entire tithe of the herd and flock every tenth animal that passes under the shepherd's rod will be holy to the LORD?"
- ''<u>Your Staff</u>''
- It was an identity. Genesis 38:25 "See if you recognize whose seal and cord and staff these are."
- It was for guiding the sheep in the right way.
- It was a picture of authority and power. Exodus 7:9

 "Take your staff and throw it down before Pharaoh, and it will become a snake."
- It was a reminder of tireless presence.
 - "By faith Jacob, when he was dying blessed each of Joseph's sons, and worshipped as he leaned on the top of his staff.." Hebrews 11:21
- It was for rescuing a sheep that was in trouble.
- 2. The Value of Those Tools. "...they comfort me." HOW? I believe...
 - ...that Your protection is perfect.
 - ...that Your discipline is for my good.
 - "Before I was afflicted I went astray, but now I obey your word?" Psalm 119:67
 - ...that You have counted me as one of Yours.
 - ...that You have identified Yourself as God.
 - ...that You guide me in Your way.
 - ...that You have all authority and power.
 - ...that You will never leave me or forsake me
 - ...that You are able to save me.
