Preparing for the Future

Ten Ways that David Prepared for Israel's Future and Faith:

1. The Place

"Then David said, "The house of the LORD God is to be here, and also the altar of burnt offering for Israel." - 1 Chronicles 22:1

• The temple and the altar would *sit* on Ornan's threshing floor *above* Jerusalem.

2. The Personnel

"So David gave orders to assemble the aliens living in Israel, and from among them he appointed stonecutters to prepare dressed stone for building the house of God." - 1 Chronicles 22:2

• Only the best labourers would work on this temple.

3. The Provision

"He provided a large amount of iron to make nails for the doors of the gateways and for the fittings, and more bronze than could be weighed." - 1 Chronicles 22:3

• The resources and funding would come from David's money.

4. The Preparations

"David said, "My son Solomon is young and inexperienced, and the house to be built for the LORD should be of great magnificence and fame and splendour in the sight of all the nations. Therefore I will make preparations for it." So David made extensive preparations before his death." - 1 Chronicles 22:5

"Now, my son, the LORD be with you, and may you have success and build the house of the LORD your God, as He said you would. ¹²May the LORD give you discretion and understanding when He puts you in command over Israel, so that you may keep the law of the LORD your God. ¹³Then you will have success if you are careful to observe the decrees and laws that the LORD gave Moses for Israel. Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or discouraged.

- ¹⁴ "I have taken great pains to provide for the temple of the LORD a hundred thousand talents of gold, a million talents of silver, quantities of bronze and iron too great to be weighed, and wood and stone. And you may add to them. ¹⁵You have many workers: stonecutters, masons and carpenters, as well as men skilled in every kind of work ¹⁶ in gold and silver, bronze and iron—craftsmen beyond number. Now begin the work, and the LORD be with you."

Begin to build the sanctuary of the LORD God, so that you may bring the ark of the covenant of the LORD and the sacred articles belonging to God into the temple that will be built for the Name of the LORD." -1 Chronicles 22:17-19
