EXPECTANT WAITING: ADVENT DEVOTIONAL



The world was waiting--waiting with bated breath for the promise of a Savior. This was the hope of the prophets of old, and this still is our hope today. QUESTION

Ask yourself: If you stripped away the gifts, the lights, the food, the festivities, the traditions-- could you still find joy? Perhaps reflecting on this will encourage you to not get swept up in the stress of the holidays but to instead cherish the moments of joy God gives, and to want to share that with others.
