D. Repentance of our sins

"Forgive us our sins, for we also forgive everyone who sins against us"

- Luke 11:4

E. Realization our shortcomings

"And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one." - Luke 11:4

F. Rejoicing in our Saviour

".. for yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen."

The Parable of Prayer. (vs. 5-8)

A. The Dilemma (vs. 5,6)

"Then Jesus said to them, "Suppose you have a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread; ⁶ a friend of mine on a journey has come to me, and I have no food to offer him."" - Luke 11:5,6

B. The Determination (vs. 7,8)

"And suppose the one inside answers, 'Don't bother me. The door is already locked, and my children and I are in bed. I can't get up and give you anything.' ⁸ I tell you, even though he will not get up and give you the bread because of friendship, yet because of your shameless audacity he will surely get up and give you as much as you need."
