Luke 5:1-11 – Observations on the power of obeying the Word.

In this text, we see a dramatization of this core value in Peter's life.

- 1. Jesus makes requests of us to see how we will respond. (vs. 3-4) "He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little from shore. Then He sat down and taught the people from the boat. ⁴ When He had finished speaking, He said to Simon, "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch." Luke 5:3,4
- 2. Jesus challenges us to trust & obey God's Word in the most important areas of our lives. (vs. 4)

"When He had finished speaking, He said to Simon, "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch." - Luke 5:4

3. We struggle in the areas where we have control or experience. "Simon answered, "Master, we've worked hard all night and haven't caught anything. But because you say so, I will let down the nets."

- Luke 5:5a

Note: To say, "Lord, you don't understand" often signifies a pride and control issue in us.

- 4. We are called to give God's Word final authority in our lives. "But because you say so, I will let down the nets." Luke 5:5b
- 5. Consistent results will happen when we consistently obey God. "When they had done so, they caught such a large number of fish that their nets began to break." Luke 5:6
