A Conditional Walk (notice the "ifs")


1 John 1:6-10

Wrong things to say about my sin:

1. I'm not responsible for my sin.

"If we **claim to be without sin**, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us."
- 1 John 1:8a

My responsibility for sin:



#### 2. Sin doesn't hurt me.

"If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us."

- 1 John 1:8b

Observations from Romans 6:

- a. Do not continue to sin. (vs. 1, 2, 15)
  - Stop it!
- b. The self must be crucified to stop sinning. (vs. 6,7)
  - Giving all to God
- c. We choose who we serve. (vs. 12,13)
- d. "You win or lose by the way you choose."

#### 3. I have not sinned.

"If we claim we have not sinned, we make Him out to be a liar and His Word is not in us."

- 1 John 1:10a

Characteristics of Confession:

- a. Agreeing with God.
- b. Admitting I've sinned.
- c. Honesty/transparency
- d. Abandoning sin.
- e. Cleansing from sin.

## A Credible Walk

"If we claim to have fellowship with Him and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live out the truth. <sup>7</sup> But if we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, His Son, purifies us from all sin."

- 1 John 1:6,7

#### 4. Freedom

"If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." - 1 John 1:9
