#### **What Determines Whether I Seek or Sit?**

1. Timing has little influence on whether I am a seeker or a sitter.

2. Position has little influence on whether I am a seeker or a sitter.

You have to recognize when the right place and the right time fuse and take advantage of that opportunity. There are plenty of opportunities out there. You can't sit back and wait." - Ellen Metcalf

#### The Difference Between Seekers and Sitters?
