The Bible's Teaching on Gambling

Definition: <u>Gambling</u>: "The act of risking what is yours in order to

get what belongs to another with nothing

given in return."

Coveting: "Eager to have more; especially what

belongs to another."

When *you* get something for nothing, remember that somebody else winds up with nothing for their something!

Biblical Principles to Consider Before Gambling:

1. Gambling breeds a form of coveting.

"You shall not covet your neighbour's house. You shall not covet your neighbour's wife, or his male or female servant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbour." - Exodus 20:17

"What causes fights and quarrels among you? Don't they come from your desires that battle within you? ² You desire but do not have, so you kill. You covet but you cannot get what you want, so you quarrel and fight. You do not have because you do not ask God. ³ When you ask, you do not receive, because you ask with wrong motives, that you may spend what you get on your pleasures."

- James 4:1-3
