The Garden of Gethsemane is...

1. A Place Where Spiritual Battles Take Place.

"On reaching the place, He said to them, "Pray that you will not fall into temptation." ⁴⁶ Get up and pray so that you will not fall into temptation."

- Luke 22:40.46

2. A Place Where Loneliness is Felt.

"He withdrew about a stone's throw beyond them, knelt down and prayed, "Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me..." - Luke 22:41,42

The "cup" Jesus prayed for the Father to take away from Him represented three things He had never experienced.

a) He would bear our sins upon Himself. - 2 Corinthians 5:21

b) He would be separated from the Father. - Matthew 27:46

c) He would experience death. - Matthew 27:50

4. Gethsemane is Where Submission is Required.

"Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done." - Luke 22:41.42

The only way to get rid of your cross is to die on it.

How do we know the difference between **Testing God and Trusting God?**

Testing God: Ask and then argue. Fight for our way, our rights.

Trusting God: Ask and accept.

Testing God: Interested in my will. Trusting God: Interested in God's will.

Testing God: I feel stress. Trusting God: I feel strength.
