JOHN, THE BELOVED —

- 1. He was the youngest of the disciples, outlived all of the others, and was said to be the only disciple to die a natural death.
- 2. Although he doesn't speak of himself in his Gospel, we still know a lot about him and about his family.
 - He was a fisherman and a disciple of John the Baptist before he became a disciple of Jesus. He was at the crucifixion and was one of the first to witness the empty tomb. He helped launch the church in Jerusalem along with Simon Peter.
 - He had a brother named James with whom he fought.

 "James son of Zebedee and his brother John (to them He gave the name Boanerges, which means Sons of Thunder)..."

 Mark 3:17
 - His father was a fisherman and owned a fishing business.
 - "When he had gone a little farther, He saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John in a boat, preparing their nets. ²⁰ Without delay He called them, and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men and followed Him."

- Mark 1:19,20

- His mother was a follower of Jesus, even to the tomb.
- "Among them were Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James and Joses, and the mother of Zebedee's sons." Matthew 27:56
- 3. He was a loving, humble man who asked for the best seat in heaven!
 - "Then James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to Him. "Teacher," they said, "we want you to do for us whatever we ask." ³⁶ "What do you want me to do for you?" He asked. ³⁷They replied, "Let one of us sit at your right and the other at your left in your glory." Mark 10:35-37
- 4. Although he was a "hillbilly" from Galilee, he lived out his life in the great city of Ephesus.
- 5. Although (according to some) he was "unschooled", he wrote five books of the New Testament.
 - "When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary men, they were astonished, and they took note that these men had been with Jesus." - Acts 4:13




