### The Gifts Jesus Left Behind

### In This Series We Have Been Learning...

- 1. That life has its troubles, but that we don't need to fear.
- 2. That believers have something that the world doesn't have.

### The Background to the Story

These are some of the last words Jesus shared in the Upper Room.

It was only a few hours before the cross.

### What Did Jesus Leave to His Followers?

### 1. A Constant Companion.

"Then Judas (not Judas Iscariot) said, "But, Lord, why do you intend to show yourself to us and not to the world?" <sup>23</sup>Jesus replied, "If anyone loves me, he will obey my teaching. My Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him. <sup>24</sup>He who does not love me will not obey my teaching. These words you hear are not my own; they belong to the Father who sent me." - John 14:22-24

Judas [the other one] asked the question that many of us would ask.

Jesus explained that He would only show Himself to those who loved Him.

However, Jesus said that He, the Father, and the Holy Spirit would live within us. *Here we must remember and do our best to understand the tri-unity of God*.

# 2. A Continual Communication (and a perfect remembrance of Jesus' teaching.)

"All this I have spoken while still with you. <sup>26</sup>But the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you." - John 14:25,26

The teaching wouldn't stop, but would be done through the work of the Holy Spirit.

### Part of the Spirit's work is to remind and teach.

- "Above all, you must understand that no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet's own interpretation. <sup>21</sup>For prophecy never had its origin in the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit." 2 Peter 1:20,21
- "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness..." 2 Timothy 3:16

#### 3. A Curious Calm.

"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." - John 14:27

Jesus called this, "His Peace." He is the source.

"And He will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. <sup>7</sup>Of the increase of His government and peace there will be no end..." - Is. 9:6,7 "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men on whom His favour rests."- Lk 2:14

What Jesus offers is very different calms than what you can find anywhere else. All other forms are short-term or false.

— Calm because of peace with God.

"There is no peace," says the LORD, "for the wicked." - Isaiah 48:22

"Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ..." - Romans 5:1

"For if, when we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to Him through the death of His Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through His life!"

- Romans 5:10

— Calm because of peace with our fellow Christians.

"Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace." - Eph. 4:3

— Calm because of peace within yourself.

"And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." - Philippians 4:7

(past, sin, weakness, mortality, direction, etc.)

### 4. A Complete Confidence.

"You heard me say, 'I am going away and I am coming back to you.' If you loved me, you would be glad that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I. <sup>29</sup>I have told you now before it happens, so that when it does happen you will believe. <sup>30</sup>I will not speak with you much longer, for the prince of this world is coming. He has no hold on me, <sup>31</sup>but the world must learn that I love the Father and that I do exactly what my Father has commanded me. Come now; let us leave." - John 14:28-31

When Jesus said that the Father was greater, He was referring to His position. (The cults love this verse!)

"If you really knew me, you would know my Father as well. From now on, you do know Him and have seen Him." - John 14:7

"Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus: <sup>6</sup>Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, <sup>7</sup>but made Himself nothing..."

- Philippians 2:5-7

Jesus didn't want us to have any surprises.

He also wanted us to see that when He said something would happen, it was fulfilled. That gives us confidence.

Jesus referred to Satan's work, through Judas, to warn the disciples of what was about to happen.
