What Do We Learn About the Widow?

1. She cried out for help in her desperate situation.

"The wife of a man from the company of the prophets cried out to Elisha, "Your servant my husband is dead, and you know that he revered the LORD. But now his creditor is coming to take my two boys as his slaves." - 2 Kings 4:1

- We are reminded that bad things can happen to good people.
- It is often during times of tremendous need that we recognize our desperate need for God.
- 2. She was obedient to the word of the LORD through Elisha.
 - "She left him and afterward shut the door behind her and her sons. They brought the jars to her and she kept pouring.' - 2 Kings 4:5

3. She took action, and her faith grew along with the oil.

What Do We Learn About Elisha?

1. He was a man of great compassion.

"Elisha replied, "How can I help you? Tell me, what do you have in your house?" - v. 2

- He was willing to help a poor widow.
- He helped her recognize what she had and gave her a way to help herself.
- 2. He was a man of great faith.
 - People turned to him in times of need. "The wife of a man from the company of prophets cried out to Elisha." - 2 Kings 4:1
 - He saw beyond the problem to God's power. "Elisha said, "Go around and ask all your neighbours for empty jars. Don't ask for just a few." - 2 Kings 4:3
 - He was not surprised by God's provision.
