#### The Arrest

1. The arrest of Jesus is unusual from many perspectives:

There were 600 soldiers and other authorities to arrest one man, and they were carrying torches, lanterns and weapons.

Jesus goes out to meet them instead of running from them.

He asked who they were seeking and responded with His favourite words, "I Am." At His words, His pursuers fell down.

He asked a second time, to clarify the exact purpose of the group. Having confirmed their purpose, He demands that the disciples be allowed to go unharmed. The officials agree, and this fulfilled the Scriptures.

"This happened so that the words He had spoken would be fulfilled: "I have not lost one of those you gave me." - John 18:9

"And this is the will of Him who sent me, that I shall lose none of all that He has given me, but raise them up at the last day.'

Peter showed bravery by attacking with a sword, but Jesus calmed the situation immediately and healed the damage.

"But Jesus answered, "No more of this!" And He touched the man's ear and healed him."

2. Finally, the arrest was completed, and Jesus was taken to Annas.
