Some Background

Pilate pronounced Jesus "Not guilty" and then had Him flogged.

"What is truth?" Pilate asked. With this he went out again to the Jews and said, "I find no basis for a charge against Him." - John 18:38

Pilate hoped the Jews would relent after seeing Jesus punished.

"When Jesus came out wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe, Pilate said to them, "Here is the man!"

All of the suffering of Jesus was part of our redemption!

"Surely He took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows, vet we considered Him stricken by God, smitten by Him, and afflicted. ⁵But He was pierced for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon Him, and by His wounds we are healed." - Isaiah 43:4.5

The Jewish Leaders and Status Quo

"If we let Him go on like this, everyone will believe in Him, and then the Romans will come and take away both our place and our nation." - John 11:48

2. These leaders thought that the best way to deal with the threat was to be rid of Jesus, so they manipulated His trial and convinced others to join them in the call for crucifixion.

"As soon as the chief priests and their officials saw Him, they shouted, "Crucify! Crucify!" But Pilate answered, "You take Him and crucify Him. As for me, I find no basis for a charge against Him." "But the chief priests and the elders persuaded the crowd to ask for Barabbas and to have Jesus executed." - Matthew 27:20

3. Having failed to get a guilty verdict on the charge of sedition, these Jews tried to use their own law to kill Jesus.

"And they began to accuse Him, saying, "We have found this man subverting our nation." He opposes payment of taxes to Caesar and claims to be Christ, a king." "The Jews insisted, "We have a law, and according to that law He must die, because He claimed to be the Son of God." "...anyone who blasphemes the name of the LORD must be put to death. The entire assembly must stone him. Whether an alien or native-born, when he blasphemes the Name, he must be put to death." - Leviticus 24:16

• The charge of claiming to be the Son of God terrified Pilate, as the Romans believed that "gods" visited people at times.

"When Pilate heard this, he was even more afraid, ⁹and he went back inside the palace."
