1. Nicodemus had visited Jesus at night because he was curious.

“Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a member of the Jewish ruling council. ²He came to Jesus at night and said, “Rabbi, we know you are a teacher who has come from God. For no one could perform the miraculous signs you are doing if God were not with Him.” - John 3:1,2

- During this time, his king was science or common sense.

2. Nicodemus then became confused.

“Nicodemus, who had gone to Jesus earlier and who was one of their own number, asked, ⁵¹Does our law condemn anyone without first hearing him to find out what he is doing?” - John 7:50,51

- During this time of his life, his king was safety.

3. Nicodemus and Joseph were finally convinced.
