"Then the disciples went back to their homes, 11but Mary stood outside the tomb crying. How Important is the Resurrection?

- 1. It is this event which proves that Jesus is the Son of God.
 - "...and who through the Spirit of holiness was declared with power to be the Son of God by His resurrection from the dead: Jesus Christ our Lord." Romans 1:4
- 2. It is the sign that He gave for His authority.

"Then the Jews demanded of Him, "What miraculous sign can you show us to prove your authority to do all this?" ¹⁹Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days." ²⁰The Jews replied, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and you are going to raise it in three days?" ²¹But the temple He had spoken of was His body. ²²After He was raised from the dead, His disciples recalled what He had said. Then they believed the Scripture and the words that Jesus had spoken." - John 2:18-22

Mary Believed and Expressed Her Belief


- 1. John had seen something that caused him to believe, but Peter was still doubting. Both men returned home. (Danger!)
 - "On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jews... John 20:19
- 2. Mary was grief-stricken and stays at the tomb. She bent down to look one more time and she saw something new.
 - This reminds us of something from the Old Testament!
 - "When Moses entered the Tent of Meeting to speak with the LORD, he heard the voice speaking to Him from between the two cherubim above the atonement cover on the ark of the Testimony. And He spoke with him." Numbers 7:89
