- 2. His name means "twin" in Hebrew or Greek. (מאום or Δίδυμος).
- 3. He was intensely loyal but seems somewhat negative in his attitude.
 - "Then Thomas (called Didymus) said to the rest of the disciples, "Let us also go, that we may die with Him." John 11:16
- 4. His love for Jesus was unwavering.
 - "And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am. ⁴You know the way to the place where I am going." ⁵Thomas said to Him, "Lord, we don't know where you are going, so how can we know the way?"

- John 14:3-5
