Insights About the Incarnation

- 1. It is an idea which permeates the New Testament.
 - John chapter 1 is a theological statement of the incarnation.
 - "The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us. We have seen His glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth."

 John 1:14
 - Philippians chapter 2 is a psychological statement of the incarnation.
 - "Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus: Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made Himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to death even death on a cross!"

- Philippians 2:5-8

Why is the Incarnation So Important?

1. It declares a truth about Jesus.

Two temptations:

- 1. To make Jesus so human that He is not divine.
- 2. To make Jesus so divine that He is not human.

Key Point:

In the incarnation God is revealed as a God who comes to us, a God who comes to where we are. His love reaches all the way to where we are!

2. To give abundant life.

"I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full." - John 10:10

3. To be a sacrifice for our sins.

"But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels, now crowned with glory and honour because He suffered death, so that by the grace of God He might taste death for everyone."

4. To destroy the works of the devil.

"The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the devil's work." - 1 John 3:8

5. To help me through my difficulties.
